Notes of an Executive Meeting held on Wednesday 13th July 2022 via Zoom

1. Chairman's Welcome

Guy welcomed everyone present.

The notes from the meeting held on Wednesday 1st June had been circulated and were agreed.

2. Matters arising from the above meeting

a. James Stephens plaque, Guy is continuing liaising with Ned to clarify the details for installing on the Almshouses. Annie has supplied a copy of the 1835 map needed for the plaque.

3.Treasurer's report

John said that he is working on a talk about William and Isobel Marshall's connection with SW Ireland. Members agreed that sounded very interesting and they were looking forward to John's talk. Sallie said she will produce a programme.

Guy has now booked the DH for all day on Saturday 20th May, as well as Wednesday 17th (usual monthly meeting) Thursday 18th evening and Sunday 21st evening.

There then followed a long discussion about CADW and the Castle. Guy and Rebecca met Phil Brown, the custodian at the Castle to discuss the Castle's involvement in the history day. Rebecca, organises a national Norman re-enactment group and has several ideas and suggestions. She will discuss with Phil Brown how best to implement and fund any event.

John feels strongly that the people of Chepstow should have 'occasionally' free admission to the castle and that maybe it is something that Chepstow Society should champion by lobbying AMs MPs etc. It was felt that this was something that needs further discussion and would be included in next executive meeting.

Annie reported that she and Ned have copies of the Son et Lumieres and the documentary film made about Echoes in the Stones.
