Village Witchcraft and Magic

It was a pleasure to see over 100 members and non-members gather in the Drill Hall on 15th March, for the talk by Professor Ronald Hutton of Bristol University, on "Village Witchcraft and Magic". It was our best-attended meeting for several years, with people travelling from far and wide to hear a fascinating talk, from an internationally-renowned expert.



The talk focused on the beliefs in witchcraft and magic held by ordinary British people between 1740 and 1940, a neglected period between the end of the witch trials and the appearance of the modern Wicca movement – and the other esoteric and spiritual activities which in the past were the preserve of the "cunning folk".

He explained the evidence which is now being studied, and which reveals a fascinating world of wise folk and charmers serving clients, in which the old fear of malevolent witchcraft was still very strong.

The talk looked at who became folk magicians and why, what techniques they used, whether they worked in groups, how much they were persecuted, and what became of their traditions. He also covered who was suspected of evil witchcraft and what happened to them.

It was an eye-opening evening on a subject about most of us knew very little, finished off with a range of interesting questions to Professor Hutton.

We have already invited him to return on another occasion to speak on another of his many areas of interest.
