Notes from the Executive Committee meeting on 26th September 2023 at the Drill Hall at 7.30pm

- 1. Guy opened the meeting and welcomed everyone.
- 2. The notes from the meeting held on 14th June had been circulated and were agreed as being a correct record.
- 3. Treasurer's report

David circulated a summary of the accounts as at 26th September 2023, he explained that the deficit was due to the expenses following the History Festival. The accounts were agreed and accepted. Guy thanked David for his report.

4. Membership Secretary's report

Angela had circulated her report to members. She had identified members who had not, as at 1st September, rejoined. She explained that they had all been contacted, and two had now rejoined. David (treasurer) added that there were four members who had rejoined but had not been identified. In addition there were two new members and one 'old' member who have paid their membership.

Action: Angela will contact members who think they have paid, but not been identified. Guy thanked Angela for her report.

5. History Festival -What next?

Various ideas and options were discussed, it was agreed that the 'Then and Now' exhibition should be shown earlier in 2024 using a similar format to the History Festival's Sunday event. The Drill Hall has already been booked for 20th July, but it was felt that it should be earlier in 2024. It was also thought that the slideshow loop could be used before the start of the monthly meetings. All agreed that there needs to be enough people available to set up and take down the exhibition.

Action: Sallie will book the Drill Hall for February depending on commitments of members and availability of the Drill Hall.

Philippa attended the last executive meeting offering her experience and ideas on how to proceed with this project. Guy reported that several members have offered to be interviewers; all agreed that care needs to be taken with the format of questioning and recording.

12. Town Walks

Keith and Guy expressed their disappointment at the uptake of the walks. Tim's Severn Princess walks, however, remained popular. It was agreed that walks should be fewer and more targeted, maybe focussing on pubs and taverns!

Guy added that during the Remembrance Day events the Church would be open for walks and talks. Action: Guy will co-ordinate with St Mary's.

Patrick sent notes about his next planned excursion, he expressed his disappointment about the response. Various suggestions were made about how to promote these events.
